The Tulip Festival Story

- The Wynyard Tulip Festival is a day of festivities held on the second Saturday of October each year from 11 am – 9 pm on the land of the tommeginer people, at Gutteridge Gardens, in Wynyard.
- In 1991, the Wynyard Tourism and Promotion Association ran the first Tulip Festival in Wynyard, offering a weekend of entertainment, stalls and attractions to promote the area and attract visitors to our town and the North West Coast.
- The Festival is now coordinated by the Waratah-Wynyard Council.

- In 2020, the Tulip Festival was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- To continue the celebrations and abide by gathering restrictions, Waratah-Wynyard Council created the Spring Loaded program, a month of fun that was comprised of smaller events for the community to enjoy.
- With the return of the Wynyard Tulip Festival in 2022, and the success of The Spring Loaded Program, Council has decided to run both events in October.
- The Spring Loaded Program now incorporates the iconic Wynyard Tulip Festival in its jampacked schedule.

About the Tulip Festival

- Entry is FREE
- The Festival starts at 11 am and finishes at 9 pm
- The Wynyard Tulip Festival is a family-oriented community event
- There will be activities at the Wynyard Foreshore Market, the Watershed, the Wynyard Wharf, Gutteridge Gardens, and the Showground.
- Road closures will be in place
- Parking is limited where possible please walk, ride, or take public transport
- Additional accessible parking will be available
- An information tent will be located near the main entrance of Gutteridge Gardens
- Wonders of Wynyard Visitors Information Centre is located at 8 Exhibition Link, Wynyard (behind Woolworths)
- Dogs on a lead are permitted, however, you should carefully consider if this is the right environment for your dog



How to get there



Parking in Wynyard is free.



Wynyard is predominately flat, with a well-developed network of footpaths.



Wynyard's roads are wide and there is lots of on-street parking.


Tulip Festival attractions stretch from the Old Bass Highway, through the heart of

town, to the top of Table Cape.



There is a free shuttle bus running from the top of Gutteridge Gardens to the Tulip Farm, return.

There is a fee to enter the Tulip Farm.



Accessible Parking



There will be additional reserved car parking spaces for accessible users in the following locations:



James Muir Community Health Centre (Hogg St)



Wynyard Community Centre (Little Goldie Street)



Wynyard CBD Parking (enter off Jackson Street)



Amenities

Accessible toilets are located at the following places:

- In the Gutteridge Gardens toilet block, located behind the main stage.
- In the CBD Plaza toilet block, located next to Noah's on Goldie Street.
- In the Woolworths toilet block, located in Woolworth's parking lot, accessible off Jackson St and Saunders St.
- At the Wonders of Wynyard, located on Exhibition Link, behind Woolworths.
- At the public toilet blocks on Old Bass Hwy, one opposite Lockett St, and one at the Rotary Playground, next to Pitt Stop Café.



Portable Toilets will be located in Gutteridge Gardens, near the War Memorial, and behind the main stage.



A Changing Places toilet is located in The Watershed.

Changing Places toilets have extra features and more space to meet the needs of people with additional requirements.

throughout the Festival site.




During the Tulip Festival, you can go to the information tent, located near the main Gutteridge Garden entrance, for help.



There will be security staff on site. They will be located in the "wet" area, where alcohol is served.



There will be a first aid station in Gutteridge Gardens.



Gutteridge Gardens



Gutteridge Gardens will be the vibrant Tulip Festival center, bursting with family-friendly activities



Mobility device users and prams should access the gardens via the footpath.

The footpath goes from Bruce's Café in East Wynyard all the way through to Jenner Street at the top of Gutteridge Gardens



Access paths will become congested due to the large volume of people attending the Festival



Limited fixed bench seating with backrests is scattered throughout the Gardens.

There will be additional temporary seating and tables.



Fireworks



The fireworks are launched from across the Inglis river.

They will be visible from Gutteridge Gardens, the Wharf, the Waterfront, The Watershed, the foreshore and the beach.



Fireworks can be stressful for animals.

If you are a Wynyard local, make sure your animals are in a safe space at 9 pm.





Fireworks are loud!

A lot of people will come to watch them.

There will be crowds.

You may smell firework smoke.



There is no fee to enter the Tulip Festival site.
View the fireworks for free.



The Wharf, Thrill Rides & Food

Learn about sustainability and how that affects us and our community






Participation is free and aimed at everyone!

Foreshore Market




Enjoy the biggest markets of the year!

There are two public toilet blocks at the market

You can follow the flat path all the way to Gutteridge Gardens, and the middle of town



Fonterra Food Street

Delight in the thrill of the rides and try your luck along sideshow alley




