Recently I've mentioned the work that's been going on with the new pedestrian bridge over the Inglis River and I'm pleased to say there will be an official opening later in the month. On Sunday 29 July there will be an opening event for the bridge and the walking track from 1pm. The 6km walk will start at Wynyard Point, near the Table Cape Bridge and include a free barbecue and fruit at the end of the walk. This event will be a great chance to use the walking track again and have a look at the work that's been done to get it open following the floods in 2016.

Although it was nothing like the floods from two years ago, we have had some more wild weather recently, which has led to some trees coming and down and roads being closed. While Council does its best to respond in these situations, there is a chance that some things may have been missed, so if you see any debris about or any other hazards, please let us know.

As you may be aware, the Department of State Growth is undertaking a planning study along the Bass Highway between Cooee and Wynyard to identify areas to improve the highway's reliability and safety. The study also includes assessment of the Cam River Bridge and looking at alternative routes for emergency access if an incident closed the bridge. Following a round of public feedback, the Department has identified some options they would like further comment on and these are listed on an Ideas Wall.
