Council calls for EOIs for Preolenna Hall

Waratah-Wynyard Council is calling for Expressions of Interest for interested parties to purchase or propose other uses for the site at 2420 Preolenna Road, known as the Preolenna Hall.

Constructed in 1970, the Hall has not been in use since 2014. Once the demand for usage ceased, power was disconnected, and the building has sat vacant since this time. The Tasmanian Fire Service, which used the adjoining station, removed vehicles and all property in 2012.

Council has commenced an Expression of Interest process to allow for equitable opportunity and to best result in an outcome that suits the Preolenna community.

“As the building has not been utilised, the condition has deteriorated,” Waratah-Wynyard Mayor Robby Walsh said.

“The hall may provide an ideal location for a new primary industry business venture or community development initiative however, will require some restoration works prior to use.”

The Preolenna Memorial will remain and be on a separate title.

EOI documents may be obtained from the Council Offices or from the council’s website. The Expression on Interest closes at 4pm on Friday, November 29.
