KEY FEEDBACK AND CHANGES TO PLAN



85% of online survey respondents believe moving the car parks towards the Old Bass Hwy to allow a new uninterrupted path to be constructed is important. Adding another ramp access to the beach has also been added to the plan. The revised plan will also require investigation into motion sensors and/or timer functions for ambient pathway lighting.



67% online survey respondents believe adding pedestrian crossings through central refuge islands are important. Some feedback was received with concerns around the final location of the two crossing points; location will be determined during detailed planning and will involve discussions with nearby property owners.



We heard that many respondents wanted to leave the market storage shed in its current location. Instead of moving the building, we will upgrade it, so it's more functional. This might include a slightly larger footprint and an awning for shade. The plan will recommend car parks to be left open during the market once the path has been realigned.



Respondents preferred the car park design to be similar to current layout whilst closer to the road to allow for the path realignment. Size of the middle car park and car park near Rotary Park Playground will be increased. No immediate changes will be made to the western car park or the boat ramp car park; instead, demand and impact will be assessed at a later date to determine any development need.



We will reduce lifestyle impacts to households by removing the eastern tourist picture point and basketball court. Council notes that the plan does not suggest removing vehicular access for property owners as is current practice. The outdoor sensory art gallery will be investigated in consultation with the Public Art Advisory Group and if recommended to proceed, an alternative location used that is not expected to impact households.



We heard that respondents generally agreed with the idea to beautify the space with specimen trees. Species selection will involve future community input and more information about planting location will become available at a later date. Additional information regarding flora and fauna protection has also been added to the plan.


